Construction of a recreation area starts on the "Altyn kyol" lakeside in Ashgabat 13/02/2021

Work to build a recreation area is in progress on the shore of the Lake "Altyn kyol", which

is located in the north of Ashgabat. Today, the President of Turkmenistan has signed the Decree launching a new phase of this project.

The phase is designed for 2021-2024. According to the document, the Ministry of Construction and Architecture will develop and submit within 3 months a master plan for the construction of this recreation area, as well as conduct a tender process to choose contractors to build the facilities.

The Kyoto Protocol, the Paris Agreement and environmental policy of Turkmenistan 17/02/2021

16 years ago, on February 16, 2005, the Kyoto Protocol entered into force. It is an international treaty that commits state parties to reduce greenhouse gas emissions into the Earth's atmosphere to combat global warming.

The Protocol extends the 1992 United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC). The Kyoto Protocol was adopted in Kyoto, Japan, in December 1997. The first commitment period started in 2008 and expired in 2012. Even before the second commitment period ends in 2020, the Paris Agreement, which is a separate instrument under the UNFCCC, was adopted.

FAO and Central Asia work towards climate-friendly and resilient livestock development 18/02/2021

Tashkent, Uzbekistan (UzDaily.com) -- A complex, FAO-led effort concluded by addressing the challenges posed by climate change to livestock keepers, as well as exploring opportunities of meat, milk, and wool production with lower emissions in the ecological and social structures of Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan.

The project, entitled "Identifying low carbon and climate resilient pathways for the ruminant sector in the selected countries of Central Asia," was led by a multidisciplinary team of technical experts Yvette Zenina, FAO natural resources officer, and Yuriy Nesterov, FAO sustainable livestock specialist, in close cooperation with the Global Agenda for Sustainable Livestock.

A criminal case has been initiated into the murder of a Bukhara deer 18/02/2021

Tashkent, Uzbekistan (UzDaily.com) -- Information and video materials on the fact of

the killing of a Bukhara deer, which is listed in the Red Book, in the Zarafshan National Natural Park of the Samarkand region, were disseminated on social networks.

According to the information, citizen D.D. applied to the prosecutor's office of Jambay district, who said that on 8 February 2021, while walking in the Zarafshan National Natural Park, he saw the head of the park and the inspectors of the 1st section shot a deer. Then on 9 February, going to the scene of the murder, citizen D.D. filmed the abandoned deer skin, deer head and traces of blood. After the shooting, he took the material evidence home and, having contacted law enforcement agencies, asked to take legal action against the perpetrators.

NeroDelta will consider a project to modernize the Uch-Kurgan hydroelectric power station 17/02/2021

NeroDelta may soon begin active work in the Kyrgyz markets. The issue of activating the company in Kyrgyzstan was discussed at the 5th annual international congress and exhibition "Hydropower: Central Asia and the Caspian", according to the website of the International Business Council of the Kyrgyz Republic.

NeroDelta is a gold sponsor of the forum, in addition, it carries out the modernization of hydropower plants, develops individual strategies for clients, from initial project assessment to final installation.

This year, the congress participants are considering the possibility of reconstructing the Uch-Kurgan hydroelectric power station - one of the first hydroelectric power stations built on the Naryn River and commissioned in 1962.

Power Machines continues to implement the project to modernize the Farhad hydroelectric power station 16/02/2021

Tashkent, Uzbekistan (UzDaily.com) -- Under the contract for the modernization of the Farhad hydroelectric power station, Power Machines delivered a hydro turbine unit No. 2 to the construction site of the station, thereby completing the supply of the main equipment under the contract.

A hydraulic turbine with a maximum capacity of 33.7 MW was produced by the Kaluga Turbine Works, which for the first time in its history manufactured a turbine for a hydroelectric power station, by order of Power Machines. In the process of assembling the turbine, carbon fiber bushings were used, antifriction materials were used, and aluminum spraying was applied as a corrosion protection.

UNDP and Canada working to provide clean water to communities in Northwestern Uzbekistan 18/02/2021

Tashkent, Uzbekistan (UzDaily.com) -- Five hundred and fifty years ago Leonardo da Vinci wrote that "water is the driving force of all nature." Where it is in abundance, we often take it for granted; but where it is absent, we suffer. Nowhere is this truer than in the now dry and deserted wastelands of the Aral Sea Basin, where an innovative new initiative, launched with support from the Canada Fund for Local Initiatives, is setting up the critical infrastructure needed to deliver clean and potable water to every home and school in the Republic of Karakalpakstan, an autonomous region within Uzbekistan.

Matilda Dimovska, UNDP Resident Representative in Uzbekistan, said the infrastructure has helped ensure at least 40,000 people in the area can drink water from their taps

without getting sick. "This has been particularly important during a year when we are dealing with the worse pandemic in a generation," she said. "Contracting the coronavirus while also getting sick from drinking unsafe water only worsens the impact of both and makes people even more vulnerable."

Foreign Ministerial Conference of Istanbul Process on Afghanistan is scheduled for the end of March 13/02/2021

Azerbaijan, China, India, Iran, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Tajikistan, Turkey, Turkmenistan, the United Arab Emirates, as well as the United Nations.

The previous, eighth ministerial conference "Heart of Asia – Istanbul Process" was held in December 2019 in Istanbul. The forum is an important regional platform for political dialogue and cooperation to promote stability, peace and prosperity in the "Heart of Asia" and to expand Afghanistan's ties with the countries of the continent.

Population of Kazakhstan has come close to 19 million 19/02/2021

The Bureau of National Statistics of the Agency for Strategic Planning and Reforms of the Republic of Kazakhstan has given the data **concerning population** of the country for

January 1, 2021.

The population of Kazakhstan for January 1, 2021 has made up 18 million 877, 1 thousand people.

In particular, the urban population makes up 11 million 149, 7 thousand people (59,1 %), rural – 7 million 727,4 thousand people (40,9 %).

As compared with January 1, 2020 the population of the country has increased by 245 thousand people or by 1, 3 %.

The greatest general growth was observed in three cities of the country: in Almaty (60, 2 thousand people), the Nur-Sultan (48, 5 thousand people) and Shymkent (38, 0 thousand people).
