Mini-hydroelectric power station to be built in Jalal-Abad 20/08/2021

The new power plant is preparing to start up 20/08/2021

On the territory of the Lebap state power plant, construction work, installation of power plants, switchgears and commissioning work at a new gas turbine power plant, which is prepared for launch by the Japanese company Sumitomo Corporation, have been completed.

The new generating facility consists of three gas turbine units of the Japanese company Mitsubishi Hitachi Power Systems, each with a capacity of 144 MW. The project was financed by the Japanese Bank for International Cooperation through a loan agreement with Vnesheconombank of Turkmenistan.
